

Document: iMediaEthics questions Marcy about her claim that Young secretly recorded her in 1967 following the *Newsweek* article.

iMediaEthics: *So Walden said that somehow or another Steve was with you and that they let you hear the whole radio program?*

Marcy: They did not. I never would've done that to my parents.

iME: *Well, I guess that you did do it with the Newsweek. In other words you knew that Newsweek was coming out in the magazine and this was right after that.*

Marcy: I didn't think it was going to be like it was or even to use my name.

iME: *So then all of a sudden now you're talking to this guy Steve Young, but did he tell you he was a journalist?*

Marcy: No.

iME: *Who'd you think he was?*

Marcy: I don't remember — just nobody, somebody who was going to let us spend the night there and help us get out of the city. We were leaving.

iME: *So your position is that you never listened to the tape?*

Marcy: Never. I was shocked.

iME: *You were shocked when?*

Marcy: When I finally did hear it, which was just a couple of years ago.

iME: *And so you never knew that phone call — did you remember the phone call?*

Marcy: I remember calling my mother. Yes, I do.

iME: *You do remember calling?*

Marcy: It was the middle of the night.

iME: *So your point of view is that somehow or another maybe the tape recorder was in the room.*

Marcy: Well...listen to the conversation. It's one-sided. He doesn't get the other side [Marcy's mom's voice] which he would get if I'd given him permission because somehow he would've rigged it up. That was his stock and trade. I certainly didn't [give permission]. He just asked if I

wanted to call my parents and I said, Could I? Because you know it costs them money. I didn't want them to have to pay for a phone call.

I had no idea.

iME: *You had no idea what?*

Marcy: That I was on some sort of radio show or recording or anything... I thought that was just private between me and my parents, that phone call.

iME: *And then the conversation with Steve, you thought that was just what?*

Marcy: Just talking.

iME: *In his apartment or his home or whatever it was?*

Marcy: Same place, I think, just talking. I never saw a recorder or anything.

iME: *Do you think that it's possible that you had forgot?*

Marcy: No, because I wouldn't have done that to my mother and father.

iME: *But you did it to your mother and father with a Newsweek article.*

Marcy: Remember, my name was not even supposed to be in there.

iME: *Right, but this one could've been the same thing where your name's not supposed to be in there but it was on the radio.*

Marcy: No. ...That's what happened with *Newsweek* and that was a big mistake.

iME: *When did you know that was a mistake?*

Marcy: The minute I saw the article.

iME: *Did you ever go to a radio station? Did you ever go to a radio station, or he just –*

Marcy: No, no. He sneakily did it. ...I didn't even know it was done.
